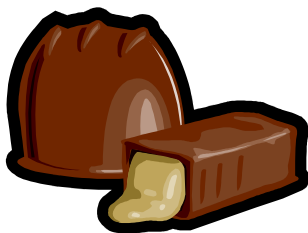

### Show Entry Rules

- \* ALL ENTRIES MUST PROVIDE A CURRENT (WITHIN 6 MONTHS) EIA
- \* Please provide your e-mail address for sending ride times
- \* Please make sure you provide all necessary signatures
- \* Refunds will only be issued if a horse is excused with a veterinary certificate

### William Clark Chamberlin Equestrian Center (WCCEC) Rules

- \* Bedding is not provided at WCCEC, bring your own. **Straw or Paper bedding is not allowed.**
- \* Members of the Chamberlin Center are still expected to pay the stall fee when they are participating in any event at the Center for which they use a stall
- \* If you wish to rent a tack stall the fee is the same as other stalls, \$20/day
- \* Be familiar with the rules of the WCCEC which are posted at the Center

### Horse and Rider

- \* Riders are encouraged to dress neatly
- \* Boots with a heel and a helmet, derby or top hat are required
- \* Horses are not required to be braided and may wear leg wraps or boots
